
\$2,000 FINE FOR ILLEGAL DEER HUNTING

A Kinmount area man has been fined a total of \$2,000 for charges related to shooting a deer that was standing on the edge of a public road.

Timothy Robinson, 32, pleaded guilty to discharging a firearm in a road right of way and tagging a deer with a deer tag issued to another person. He was fined \$1,000 for each offence.

Court was told that on November 14, 2008, Robinson was driving his all-terrain vehicle south of Minden. As he reached the Ritchie Falls Road, he saw a deer standing on side of the road. Robinson got off his vehicle and fired down the road hitting and later killing the deer.

Court also heard the deer was later tagged with an illegally transferred deer tag.

Justice of the Peace Diane Jackson heard the case in the Ontario Court of Justice, Minden, on January 15, 2009.
