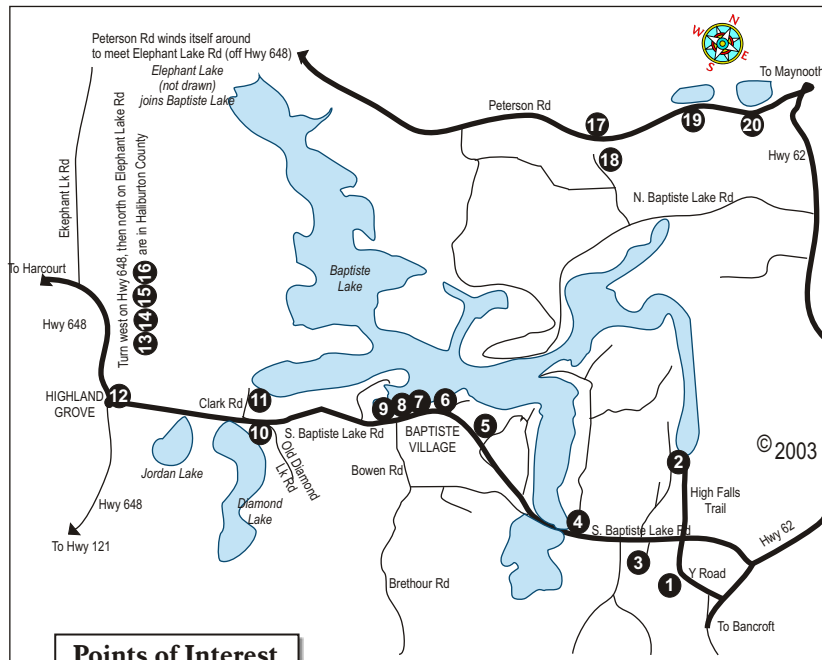
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Points of Interest

- 1 G-P Flakeboard, over 125 employees, largest employer in the area. Manufacturing pressboard for furniture.
- 2 High Falls Dam, scenic lookout over Baptiste Lake & York River. Historic logging route—plaque at the falls.
- 3 Moore's Bridge, Firehall Park, picnic area on York River.
- 4 Redmond Bay (Mud Creek) where passengers arrived by Stagecoach to board the I.B.&O. for Baptiste Station early 1900s.
- 5 Birch Cliff Lodge, original home of first settler, Wm. Mulcahey.
- 6 Baptiste Village—St. Matthew's United Church. Built in 1800s on Bowen Rd. When the hill proved too great a challenge for churchgoers, the church was moved board by board in 1942 to this location, donated by Hiram Grant.
- 7 Sunset view of Baptiste Lake. A 25-mile waterway named for Algonquin Chief Jean Baptiste.
- 8 Public Dock; Algonquin settlement—plaque.
- 9 Site of old Grant's Store, built by Mulcahey in 1910 for trainman, loggers, tourists. The I.B.&O. rail line est. in 1900 ran parallel to the lake on this property.
- 10 Old Diamond Lake Rd. (public beach).
- 11 Clark Rd.—Camp Ponacka, summer camp for boys.
- 12 Highland Grove, old general store.
- 13 Elephant Lake Rd.
- 14 Martin Wood Resort, former head office of G.W. Martin Ltd., largest producer of hardwood lumber in Canada. Access to Benoir Lakes, the upper region of Baptiste waterway.
- 15 Kingscott Lake in Algonquin Park.
- 16 South Algonquin Trails, riding stables, former site of Martin's Lumber Mill.
- 17 Peterson Rd., Historic Colonization Rd. Watch for deer-yards.
- 18 Herschel Forest Trail—to Dog Bay Rd.
- 19 Little Lighthouse Lake.
- 20 Big Lighthouse Lake.
